Itinerary

Oct 30: coastal marshes and sand beach habitat at Pantanos de Villa; riparian and agricultural lands of lower Santa Eulalia valley

Oct 31: west Andean scrub, *polylepis* forest and puna grasslands of upper Santa Eulalia valley

Nov 1: puna grassland and bog at Tielio and Marcapomacocha

Nov 2: freshwater lake and marshes, puna grasslands at Lago de Junin

Nov 3: upper montane evergreen and cloud forest at Paty trail

Nov 4: elfin forest, paramo grassland, and agricultural land at Bosque Unchog

Nov 5: cloud forest at Carpish Tunnel; secondary forest at Villa Jennifer

Nov 6: secondary forest at Tingo Maria National Park, and cave habitat at Oilbird Caves

Nov 7: secondary riverine forest at Tingo Maria National Park

Nov 8: secondary forest and riparian habitat at Villa Jennifer and Gorge de Rio Chin; cloud forest at Carpish Tunnel

Nov 9: intermontane scrub and *polylepis* forest at La Quinua

Nov 10: agricultural habitat, Tarma market, and travel day

Nov 11: Lima pelagic birding and seabird colony at Isla Palomino

Nov 12: mist oasis habitat and dry cactus habitat at Lomas de Lachay Reserve

This trip list follows the taxonomic order and nomenclature Clements 6th Edition (updated 2014). The statuses of threatened bird species are derived from Birdlife International (Threatened Species).

Highlights: 25 endemics, Torrent Duck, White-tufted and Great Grebe, Waved Albatross, **Markham's, Ringed** and Elliot's **Storm-Petrel**, Peruvian Diving-Petrel, Andean Condor, Chilean Flamingo, Giant Coot, Black (Junin) Rail, Peruvian Thick-knee, **Diademed Plover**, Gray-breasted and Least Seedsnipe, Swallow-tailed Gull, **Blue-headed Macaw**, Oilbird flight, Andean Hillstar, Giant Hummingbird, Black Metaltail, **Blue-mantled Thornbill**, Band-tailed Fruiteater, **Andean Cock-of-the-Rock** on the **nest**, Gray-breasted Mountain-Toucan, Black-necked Woodpecker, Thick-billed and Slender-billed Miner, Surf Cinclodes, Creamy-crested and Baron's Spinetail, Cactus Canastero, **young Undulated Antpitta** at nest, Tschudi's Tapaculo, **Unstreaked Tit-Tyrant**, Many-colored Rush-Tyrant, four Chat-Tyrants, Rufous-webbed and **Rufous-bellied Bush-Tyrant**, Red-crested and **Bay-vented Cotinga**, Chestnut-collared Swallow, Andean Cock-of-the-Rock, White-capped Dipper, three Pipits, **Brown-flanked Tanager**, six species of Mountain-Tanager, **Pardusco**, **Great Inca-Finch**, Paramo Seedeater, Thick-billed and Black Siskin; and of course many other bird species, non-birds include great looks of Vicuna and Viscacha, and a myriad of butterflies

Tinamous - *Tinamidae*

*Little Tinamou (*Crypturellus soui*): Heard at Tingo Maria National Park on the 6th and at Villa Jennifer Nov 8th.

Undulated Tinamou (*Crypturellus undulatus*): Heard from the Villa Jennifer grounds on Nov 6th to 8th, and one observed on the grounds on the 7th.

Ornate Tinamou (*Nothoprocta ornata*): Great looks of one crossing the road at Lago Junin on the Nov 2nd.

Andean Tinamou (*Nothoprocta pentlandii*): Good looks of one at Santa Eulalia valley on Oct 31st and another on the way down from Bosque Unchog on Nov 4th.

Curve-billed Tinamou (*Nothoprocta curvirostris*): One observed in fields and flight on the way to Bosque Unchog on Nov 4th.

Ducks - *Anatidae*

Andean Goose (*Chloephaga melanoptera*): Fairly common in the high puna wetlands of upper Santa Eulalia, Ticlio and Marcapomacocha bogs, and the Lago Junin area.

Crested Duck (*Lophonetta specularioides*): About 20 estimated at Lago Junin on Nov 2nd.

Torrent Duck (*Merganetta armata*): A pair with two young observed at upper Santa Eulalia road on Oct 31st.

Mallard (*Anas platyrhynchos*) **Introduced**: One (potential escapee) was at the ponds of the interpretive centre at Pantanos de Villa on Oct 30th.

Cinnamon Teal (*Anas cyanoptera*): Ten were at the ponds at the interpretive Centre Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th.

White-cheeked Pintail (*Anas bahamensis*): Good looks of eight at Pantanos de Villa on Oct 30th.

Yellow-billed Pintail (*Anas georgica*): Approximately 10 observed at Lago Junin on Nov 2nd.

Puna Teal (*Anas puna*): Fairly common (20) at Lago Junin and at the Cerro de Pasco wetlands.

Yellow-billed (Speckled) Teal (*Anas flavirostris*): Common at Lago Junin: 100's observed along the drying shores of Lago Junin; several along the shores of the lakes at the area of Cerro de Pasco pass north of Junin on the 9th.

Ruddy (Andean) Duck (*Oxyura (ferruginea) jamaicensis*): The southern black-headed race of Ruddy Duck was observed at a few localities including Pantanos de Villa, Ticlio Bog, and Lago Junin with a high of 10.

Guans - *Cracidae*

Speckled Chachalaca (*Ortalis guttata*): A few observed daily at the Villa Jennifer grounds and Tingo Maria National Park Nov 5-8th.

Andean Guan (*Penelope montagnii*): Three observed at the Paty Trail on Nov 3rd and two at Carpish Pass on Nov 5th.

Grebes - *Podicipedidae*

White-tufted Grebe (*Rollandia rolland*): This pretty grebe was observed twice, a single at Lago Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th and two in an irrigation ditch at Lago Junin on Nov 2nd.

Pied-billed Grebe (*Podilymbus podiceps*): Four observed at the Pantanos de Villa wetlands on Oct 30th.

Great Grebe (*Podiceps major*): Three of this elegant grebe were observed at Pantanos de Villa wetlands Oct 30th, most still in alternate plumage.

Flamingos - *Phoenicopteridae*

Chilean Flamingo (*Phoenicopterus chilensis*) **Near threatened**: Hundreds were observed at Lago Junin Nov 2nd.

Penguins - *Spheniscidae*

Humboldt Penguin (*Spheniscus humboldti*) **Vulnerable**: Over 100+ penguins were observed on the breeding rocks of Isla Palomino Nov 12th.

Albatrosses - *Diomedidae*

Waved Albatross (*Phoebastria irrorata*) **Critically Endangered**: Two observed on the pelagic Nov 12th including good looks of a bird coming in during chumming.

Shearwaters - *Procellariidae*

White-chinned Petrel (*Procellaria aequinoctialis*) **Vulnerable**: Great looks of this heavy-bodied petrel with eight seen and a few around the boat at close quarters during chumming Nov 12th.

Pink-footed Shearwater (*Puffinus creatopus*) **Vulnerable**: Two observed further out during chumming on the pelagic of Nov 12th.

Sooty Shearwater (*Puffinus griseus*) **Near threatened**: Three observed on the pelagic Nov 12th.

Diving-Petrels - *Pelecanoididae*

Peruvian Diving-Petrel (*Pelecanoides garnotti*) **Endangered**: Six observed in flight on the pelagic some offering good views. Flight alcid-like.

Storm-Petrels - *Hydrobatidae*

Wilson's Storm-Petrel (*Oceanites oceanicus*): Fairly common offshore with most seen closer to shore than White-vented.

Elliot's (White-vented) Storm-Petrel (*Oceanites gracilis*) **Data deficient**: Common on the pelagic with 100's seen and a few attracted to chum around the boat offering close views.

Ringed Storm-Petrel (*Oceanodroma hornbyi*) **Data deficient**: Two of this pretty storm-petrel was observed during the pelagic Nov 12th.

Wedge-rumped Storm-petrel (*Oceanodroma tethys*): Great looks of one circling the boat during chumming on the pelagic on Nov 12th. Deep, powerful wing strokes compared to the other storm-petrels were apparent.

Markham's Storm-Petrel (*Oceanodroma markhami*) **Data deficient**: Six were observed on Nov 12th including some during chumming on the pelagic.

Boobies - *Sulidae*

Blue-footed Booby (*Sula nebouxii*): One adult observed with Peruvian Boobies at Isla Palomino Nov 12th.

Peruvian Booby (*Sula variegata*): Common along the coast; thousands of breeding pairs observed at Isla Palomino.

Cormorants - *Phalacrocoracidae*

Neotropic Cormorant (*Phalacrocorax brasilianus*): Common along the coast: 100's at Pantanos de Villa, and during the pelagic trip.

Red-legged Cormorant (*Phalacrocorax gaimardi*) **Near threatened**: About 50 of this striking cormorant was seen at Isla Palomino Nov 12th.

Guanay Cormorant (*Phalacrocorax bougainvillii*) **Near-threatened**: Approximately 150 were offshore at Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th about 50 were seen on Isla Palomino off of the Lima coast Nov 12th.

Pelicans - *Pelecanidae*

Peruvian Pelican (*Pelecanus thagus*) **Near threatened**: Common along the coast.

Hérons - *Ardeidae*

Fasciated Tiger-Heron (*Tigrisoma fasciatum*): One was observed flying down the creek at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th and two were fishing from boulders on the Huallaga River en route to Carpish Pass Nov 8th.

Great Egret (*Ardea alba*): Small numbers observed on most days in the lowlands.

Snowy Egret (*Egretta thula*): Twenty at Pantanos de Villa on Oct 30th

Little Blue Heron (*Egretta caerulea*): Fifteen observed at Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th.

Cattle Egret (*Bubulcus ibis*): Common and widespread in open areas at lower elevations.

Striated Heron (*Butorides striata*): One at Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th and a few seen at Tingo Maria Nov 5th to 8th.

Capped Heron (*Pilherodius pileatus*): One was observed flying over at Villa Jennifer Nov 7th and two breeding plumaged birds were at rice fields outside Tingo Maria on the 8th.

Black-crowned Night-Heron (*Nycticorax nycticorax*): Approximately 40 were at Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th; and three were seen in flight around the Lima area Nov 10th and 11th.

Yellow-crowned Night-Heron (*Nyctanassa violacea*): An adult was observed roosting in reeds at the edge of a pond Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th.

Ibises - *Threskiornithidae*

Puna Ibis (*Plegadis ridgwayi*): Common at Pantanos de Villa and 100's in the puna grasslands of the highlands.

Green Ibis (*Mesembrinibis cayennensis*): Three observed at Villa Jennifer on Nov 7th including a couple perched on the top of a dead tree offering scope views.

Black-faced (Andean) Ibis (*Theristicus melanopis branickii*): Three of the Andean *branickii* race of Black-faced Ibis were observed in flight at the east end of Lago Junin Nov 2nd.

New World Vultures - *Cathartidae*

Black Vulture (*Coragyps atratus*): Common and widespread in the lowlands both coasts.

Turkey Vulture (*Cathartes aura*): A few were observed in the Tingo Maria area and 10 at Isla Palomino on Nov 12th.

Andean Condor (*Vultur gryphus*) **Near-threatened**: Good looks on an adult at the gorge and bridge area, Santa Eulalia valley Oct 31st and three others were observed at a distance further up the valley.

Osprey - *Pandionidae*

Osprey (*Pandion haliaetus*): One observed at Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th.

Hawks - *Accipitridae*

Hook-billed Kite (*Chondrohierax uncinatus*): One dark phase bird observed circling at the beginning of the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park on the 7th.

Swallow-tailed Kite (*Elanoides forficatus*): Three at the Paty trail on Nov 3rd, five were present at Carpish Pass on Nov 5th and eight counted on the 8th.

Double-toothed Kite (*Harpagus bidentatus*): Likely the same individual was seen on Nov 5th, 7th and 8th at the Villa Jennifer grounds.

Plumbeous Kite (*Ictinia plumbea*): A small flock were observed soaring over Villa Jennifer on all days there with a high of seven seen on Nov 8th.

Roadside Hawk (*Rupornis magnirostris*): Two were observed on the Villa Jennifer grounds on Nov 8th.

Harris's Hawk (*Parabuteo unicinctus*): Eight were present at the Pantanos de Villa marsh on Oct 30th.

Variable Hawk (*Geranoaetus polyosoma*): A few of these *buteos* were observed of both races with a high of six seen on Nov 2nd in the Lago Junin area.

Black-chested Buzzard-Eagle (*Geranoaetus melanoleucus*): A few were observed in the Andean highlands in the Santa Eulalia valley, Lago Junin area, and at Huanuco with a high of 10 observed at Lomas de Lachay on Nov 11th.

Sunbitterns - *Eurypygidae*

Sunbittern (*Eurpyga helias*): One heard by the stream at the oilbird caves Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th.

Rails - Rallidae

Black (Junin Rail) (*Laterallus jamaicensis tuerosi*) **ENDEMIC Endangered**: This endangered race of the Black Rail was heard at the marshes outside Ondores Nov 2nd; AM was fortunate to see one scurry between grass tussocks.

Plumbeous Rail (*Pardirallus sanguinolentus*): Two observed at Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th including scope views.

Common Gallinule (*Gallinula galeata*): Common at Pantanos de Villa; several seen at Lago Junin Nov 2nd.

Giant Coot (*Fulica gigantea*): Four seen at Ticlio Bog Oct 1st; a single at Lago Junin the following day; and en route to Lima Nov 9th and 10th.

Slate-colored (Andean) Coot (*Fulica ardesiaca*): Common at coastal and altiplano marshes.

Limpkins - Aramidae

Limpkin (*Aramus guarauna*): Heard calling at the Villa Jennifer grounds on Nov 8th and 9th; good looks of a perched bird while having breakfast on the 10th.

Thick-Knees - Burhinidae

Peruvian Thick-knee (*Burhinus superciliaris*): Great looks with three viewed through scope at close quarters at Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th.

Avocets - Recurvirostridae

Black-necked Stilt (*Himantopus mexicanus mexicanus*): Thirty were at the ponds by the beach at Pantanos de Villa on the 30th.

Oystercatchers - Haematopodidae

American Oystercatcher (*Haematopus palliatus*): Three were at the beach at Pantanos de Villa on the 30th.

Blackish Oystercatcher (*Haematopus ater*): Two on the rocks at the Isla Palomino seabird colony on Nov 12th.

Plovers - Charadriidae

Andean Lapwing (*Vanellus resplendens*): Common in the altiplano: four were at Ticlio Bog on the 1st, dozens were in the grasslands surrounding Lago Junin on the 2nd, three at Bosque Unchog on Nov 4th, and two at the Cerro de Pasco pass Nov 9th.

Killdeer (*Charadrius vociferous*): Two at Pantanos de Villa on Oct 30th.

Diademed Sandpiper-Plover (*Phegornis mitchellii*): Excellent views of a pair at Marcopomacocha Bog on Nov 1st.

Seedsnipes - *Thinocoridae*

Grey-breasted Seedsnipe (*Thinocorus orbignyianus*): Three were flushed in the Marcapomacocha Bog area Nov 1st.

Least Seedsnipe (*Thinocorus rumicivorus*): Common at Lomas de Lachay with about 30 seen, including many young.

Sandpipers - *Scolopacidae*

Spotted Sandpiper (*Actitis macularius*): Four were at Pantanos de Villa on Oct 30th, and singles seen along the Huallaga River Nov 6th and 8th, and one at Callao harbor on the 12th.

Greater Yellowlegs (*Tringa melanoleuca*): Thirty were foraging at the marsh edge at Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th and three at Lago Junin on Nov 2nd.

Whimbrel (*Numenius phaeopus*): Two hundred were at the beach at Pantanos de Villa on Oct 30th.

Ruddy Turnstone (*Arenaria interpres*): Two were flying along the beach Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th and a flock of thirty, were on the jetty at Callao harbor Nov 12th.

Surfbird (*Calidris virgata*): A flock of thirty was on the jetty at Callao harbor Nov 12th.

Sanderling (*Calidris alba*): Ten were at the beach at Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th.

Baird's Sandpiper (*Calidris bairdii*): One observed at Lago Junin Nov 2nd.

Semipalmated Sandpiper (*Calidris pusilla*): A single was at the edge of the beach pond at Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th.

Puna Snipe (*Gallinago andina*): Six were flushed from Ticlio and Marcapomacocha Bog area on Nov 1st and four at the Lago Junin area Nov 2nd while looking for the Junin Rail.

Wilson's Phalarope (*Phalaropus tricolor*): Five were seen at Pantanos de Villa on Oct 30th.

Red-necked Phalarope (*Phalaropus lobatus*): Over a hundred observed in small flocks on the pelagic Nov 12th.

Red Phalarope (*Phalaropus fulicarius*): Three basic plumaged birds seen on the pelagic Nov 12th.

Skuas - *Stercorariidae*

Pomarine Jaeger (*Stercorarius pomarinus*): Approximately were 20 observed during the pelagic trip Nov 11th with some harassing Inca Terns and gulls.

Gulls - *Laridae*

Swallow-tailed Gull (*Creagrus furcatus*): Five in flight in front of the boat offshore on the pelagic trip Nov 12th. This gull was larger than Sabine's and had a heavier flight.

Sabine's Gull (*Xema sabini*): One adult seen far offshore on the pelagic Nov 12th.

Andean Gull (*Chroicocephalus serranus*): Fairly common at high Andean lakes and marshes.

Gray-hooded Gull (*Chroicocephalus cirrocephalus*): About 20 seen around Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th including immature and breeding plumaged birds.

Gray Gull (*Leucophaeus modestus*): An adult was observed with other gulls at the beach area, Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th and three were perched on the jetty at Callao Nov 12th.

Franklin's Gull (*Leucophaeus pipixcan*): Common along the coast: hundreds at Pantanos de Villa and Callao harbor.

Belcher's (Band-tailed) Gull (*Larus belcheri*): Common along the coast.

Kelp Gull (*Larus dominicanus*): A few were observed at Pantanos de Villa on Oct 30th, and during the pelagic trip Nov 12th.

Inca Tern (*Larosterna inca*): Common offshore at Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th; hundreds observed including close views of several perched at Callao harbor during the pelagic trip and on the breeding cliffs at Isla Palomino Nov 13th.

South American Tern (*Sterna hirundinacea*): An adult was flying over the boat during the pelagic Nov 12th.

Elegant Tern (*Thalasseus elegans*): Common (50+) along the beach at Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th and over 50 foraging over Callao harbor Nov 12th.

Black Skimmer (*Rhynchops niger*): Thirty were seen along the beach at Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th.

Pigeons - *Columbidae*

Rock Pigeon (*Columba livia*): Common and widespread in towns and villages.

Spot-winged Pigeon (*Patagioenas maculosa*): A few observed at Santa Eulalia valley on Oct 31st; up to 15 were at the Hacienda La Florida on Nov 1st and 20 the following day, and a few on Nov 10th.

Band-tailed Pigeon (*Patagioenas fasciata*): Two observed in flight along the Paty trail Nov 3rd, common in the fields en route to Bosque Unchog and two at Carpish Pass on Nov 8th.

*Plumbeous Pigeon (*Patagioenas plumbea*): Heard at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th.

Plain-breasted Ground-Dove (*Columbina minuta*): Four observed in the fields adjacent Hacienda Santa Cruz, Huanuco on Nov 5th.

Ruddy Ground-Dove (*Columbina talpacoti*): A couple of pairs were seen on the grounds of Villa Jennifer Nov 4th and Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th.

Croaking Ground-Dove (*Columbina cruziana*): Fairly common along the coast with many seen and distinctive call heard - 20 observed in the lower Santa Eulalia valley on Oct 30th; common in upper Santa Eulalia valley on the 31st and several seen at Hacienda Santa Cruz on Nov 5th.

Bare-faced Ground-Dove (*Metriopelia ceciliae*): Five observed in the upper Santa Eulalia valley Oct 31st; and five at a roadside stop en route to La Quinoa Nov 9th.

Black-winged Ground-Dove (*Metriopelia melanoptera*): A pair was feeding in short grass at the outskirts of Ondores, Lago Junin Nov 2nd.

White-tipped Dove (*Leptotila verreauxi*): Four singles were flushed from the road while driving up the Santa Eulalia valley on Oct 31st and one was seen at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

Grey-fronted Ground-Dove (*Leptotila rufaxilla*): Singles were seen Nov 6th and 7th at Tingo Maria National Park.

West Peruvian Dove (*Zenaida meloda*): Common and widespread along the coast.

Eared Dove (*Zenaida auriculata*): Common and widespread along the coast, around Hacienda Santa Cruz and in the fields en route to Bosque Unchog Nov 5th.

Cuckoos - *Cuculidae*

Squirrel Cuckoo (*Piaya cayana*): Two observed daily at Villa Jennifer and Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th-8th.

Smooth-billed Ani (*Crotophaga ani*): One observed at Villa Jennifer Nov 6th.

Groove-billed Ani (*Crotophaga sulcirostris*): A pair was at the lower Santa Eulalia valley on Nov 1st and several were observed at Lomas de Lachay on the Nov 11th.

Owls - *Strigidae*

*Tropical Screech-Owl (*Megascops choliba*): One heard on the Villa Jennifer grounds Nov 5th.

*Band-bellied Owl (*Pulsatrix melanota*): Heard at Villa Jennifer on Nov 5th.

Peruvian Pygmy-Owl (*Glaucidium peruanum*): Two observed at including scope looks at Santa Eulalia valley on Nov 2nd.

Burrowing Owl (*Athene cunicularia*): One observed along a fence line near Lago Junin on Nov 9th and 40+ were observed at Lomas de Lachay Nov 11th including several family groups and many in the dry south end of the reserve.

Oilbirds - *Steatornithidae*

Oilbird (*Steatornis caripensis*): The group was witness to a wildlife spectacle at the oilbird caves Nov 6th. Thousands of screeching, wailing oilbirds exited the cave between 620-640 PM peaking at 630.

Swifts - *Apodidae*

Chestnut-collared Swift (*Streptoprocne rutila*): A small flock of five observed foraging over Hacienda Santa Cruz on the 3rd, and 30 seen on the 7th.

White-collared Swift (*Streptoprocne zonaris*): A flock of around 30 Paty Trail Nov 3rd and about the same number foraging high above Hacienda Santa Cruz on the Nov 8th.

Chimney Swift (*Chaetura pelagica*) **Near Threatened**: A lone bird was foraging above Hacienda La Florida Nov 10th.

Andean Swift (*Aeronautes andecolus*): Thirty observed at the gorge/bridge area and upper Santa Eulalia valley on Nov 2nd.

Fork-tailed Palm-Swift (*Tachornis squamata*): Several seen on the Villa Jennifer grounds and adjacent Tingo Maria National Park Nov 5th, 6th and 8th.

Hummingbirds - *Trochilidae*

White-bearded Hermit (*Phaethornis hispidus*): One observed along the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 7th.

Reddish Hermit (*Phaethornis ruber*): A single observed along the river at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th.

Black-throated Mango (*Anthracothorax nigricollis*): A female was perched a wire en route to Villa Jennifer on Nov 5th, and another at Villa Jennifer gardens.

Amethyst-throated Sunangel (*Heliangelus amethysticollis*): Two along the Paty trail Nov 3rd and five seen at Carpish Pass Nov 5th.

Green-tailed Trainbearer (*Lesbia nuna*): Trainbearers at Hacienda La Florida Nov 1st were identified as this species though separation of the two species is difficult.

Bronze-tailed Comet (*Polyonymus caroli*) **ENDEMIC**: Good looks were obtained in the Santa Eulalia valley on Oct 31st with two seen.

Andean Hillstar (*Oreotrochilus estella*) **ENDEMIC**: Great looks of up to three this dazzling hummer, feeding on orange flowers at La Quinoa *polylepis* forest.

Blue-mantled Thornbill (*Chalcostigma stanleyi*): Good looks of one at La Quinoa *polylepis* woodland Nov 9th.

Tyrian Metaltail (*Metallura tyrianthina*): One along the Paty Trail on the Nov 3rd; three observed en route to Bosque Unchog; and two at Carpish Pass Nov 5th.

Coppery Metaltail (*Metallura theresiae*) **ENDEMIC**: Several observed at Bosque Unchog Nov 4th.

Black Metaltail (*Metallura phoebe*) **ENDEMIC**: This striking silky black endemic was fairly common on the grounds of Hacienda La Florida. Several observed daily Oct 31st to Nov 2nd, and on Nov 9th and 10th.

Sapphire-vented Puffleg (*Eriocnemis luciani*): One observed perched along the Paty Trail Nov 3rd by Tom.

Collared Inca (*Coeligena torquata*): One observed at Carpish Pass Nov 5th.

Violet-throated Starfrontlet (*Coeligena violifer*): One or two observed along the Carpish Pass and Paty trails Nov 3rd, 5th and 8th. Another at Bosque Unchog Nov 4th.

Sword-billed Hummingbird (*Ensifera ensifera*): Pablo observed one flying by at Bosque Unchog Nov 4th.

Giant Hummingbird (*Patagona gigas*): Observed in upper Santa Eulalia Valley on Oct 31st; daily in the gardens of Hacienda La Florida; and a few were also seen along the Central Highway on Nov 9th.

Long-billed Starthroat (*Heliomaster longirostris*): Singles observed at the grounds of Villa Jennifer on Nov 7th and 8th.

Purple-collared Woodstar (*Myrtis fanny*): Three female-type birds observed at Santa Eulalia valley Oct 30th and 31st; and 10 were at Lomas de Lachay on Nov 9th.

Oasis Hummingbird (*Rhodopsis vesper*): Common at Lomas de Lachay on Nov 11th where approximately 20 were seen mostly at the dry southern eastern side.

Peruvian Sheartail (*Thaumastura cora*): One observed at Santa Eulalia Valley on Oct 31st, and another female at Lomas de Lachay Nov 11th by Linda and Viveka.

White-bellied Hummingbird (*Amazilia chionogaster*): One or two observed daily on the grounds of Hacienda Santa Cruz Nov 3-5th.

Amazilia Hummingbird (*Amazilia amazilia*): Five were seen in and around Lima on Oct 30th and two at Lomas de Lachay Nov 11th.

Sapphire-spangled Emerald (*Amazilia lactea*): Great looks of both sexes at Villa Jennifer. Two or three were seen Nov 5th, 7th and 8th on the grounds of Villa Jennifer.

Trogons - Trogonidae

Masked Trogon (*Trogon personatus*): Good views of a single along the Paty trail on Nov 3rd.

Motmots – Momotidae

Amazonia (Blue-crowned) Motmot (*Momotus momota*): One observed along the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th and 7th.

Kingfishers – Alcedinidae

Amazon Kingfisher (*Chloroceryle amazona*): One observed along the Huallaga River Nov 8th.

Puffbirds - Bucconidae

Black-fronted Nunbird (*Monasa nigrifrons*): Five at the Oilbird caves on Nov 6th; and two the following day along the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park.

White-fronted Nunbird (*Monasa morphoeus*): A group of five were seen along the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park Nov 7th.

Jacamars - Galbulidae

Bluish-fronted Jacamar (*Galbula cyanescens*): One observed along the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th and 7th.

New World Barbets - Capitonidae

Gilded Barbet (*Capito auratus*): Two observed at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th.

Toucans - *Ramphastidae*

Gray-breasted Mountain-Toucan (*Andigena hypoglauca*) **Near Threatened**: Great views of one by Viveka and Roy at the beginning of the Paty Trail on Nov 3rd, and the group had excellent leisurely looks of two at the same location Nov 8th.

Chestnut-eared Aracari (*Pteroglossus castanotis*): Two observed at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th, six along the Huallaga River track on the 7th, and three at Villa Jennifer on Nov 8th.

Woodpeckers - *Picidae*

Lafresnaye's Piculet (*Picumnus lafresnayi*): One observed by Mitch and Amy in a bird flock at the grounds of Villa Jennifer on Nov 8th.

Yellow-tufted Woodpecker (*Melanerpes cruentatus*): Two observed at Villa Jennifer Nov 8th.

Little Woodpecker (*Veniliornis passerinus*): Two were observed along the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park Nov 7th.

Black-necked Woodpecker (*Colaptes atricollis*) **ENDEMIC**: Good looks were obtained of this endemic with four seen at Santa Eulalia valley on Oct 31st.

Andean Flicker (*Colaptes rupicola*): One at the Marcapomacocha Bog on 1st and common in the puna grasslands surrounding the Lago Junin area Nov 2nd.

Lineated Woodpecker (*Dryocopus lineatus*): Two observed at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

Crimson-crested Woodpecker (*Campephilus melanoleucos*): One observed at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th and two along the Huallaga River track Nov 7th.

Falcons - *Falconidae*

Black Caracara (*Daptrius ater*): Observed daily including perched birds from the Villa Jennifer grounds and at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 5th to 8th.

Mountain Caracara (*Phalcoboenus megalopterus*): Fairly common in the altiplano with two observed at upper Santa Eulalia Valley on Oct 31st and several at Marcapomacocha Bog on Nov 1st and high of six observed in the Lago Junin area on the 2nd.

American Kestrel (*Falco sparverius*): Widespread and fairly common on the west slope and highlands. One or two observed most days.

Merlin (*Falco columbarius*): One observed by TP at Hacienda Santa Cruz on Nov 9th.

Aplomado Falcon (*Falco femoralis*): Good looks of this falcon perched and in flight at Marcapomacocha Bog on Nov 1st and two in over-flight at La Quinoa on Nov 9th.

Bat Falcon (*Falco ruficularis*): One at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 7th and two along the river track on Nov 8th.

Peregrine Falcon (*Falco peregrinus*): One observed en route to Pantanos de Villa on the Oct 30th one Lima on Nov 11th, and two at Isla Palomino on Nov 12th.

Parrots - *Psittacidae*

Mountain Parakeet (*Psilopsiagon aurifrons*): Fifteen observed feeding and in flight above the gorge at Santa Eulalia Valley Oct 31st.

Andean Parakeet (*Bolborhynchus orbygnesi*): A flock of 50 was seen in flight in the lower Santa Eulalia valley Oct 30th.

Blue-headed Parrot (*Pionus menstruus*): Fairly common at the grounds of Villa Jennifer and Tingo Maria National Park - with many seen flying over daily, Nov 5th-8th.

Scaly-naped Parrot (*Amazona mercenarius*): A pair was seen in flight and perched at the beginning of the Paty Trail Nov 8th.

Pacific Parrotlet (*Forpus coelestis*): Tom observed one in flight at lower Santa Eulalia valley Oct 30th.

Blue-headed Macaw (*Primolius couloni*) **Vulnerable**: Two observed in flight at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th and three pairs Nov 7th.

Scarlet-fronted Parakeet (*Psittacara wagleri*): Approximately 150 observed in flocks flying down lower Santa Eulalia Valley in the evening of Oct 30th.

White-eyed Parakeet (*Psittacara leucophthalmus*): Common at Tingo Maria National Park and fling over Villa Jennifer.

Antbirds - *Thamnophilidae*

Great Antshrike (*Taraba major*): A calling female was observed along the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park Nov 7th.

Chestnut-backed Antshrike (*Thamnophilus palliatus*): Good looks of one in the open at a roadside stop on the way to Carpish Tunnel Nov 9th.

Variable Antshrike (*Thamnophilus caerulescens*): One heard along the Paty Trail Nov 3rd.

Plain-winged Antshrike (*Thamnophilus schistaceus*): Two observed at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th and another along the Huallaga River track Nov 7th.

Pygmy Antwren (*Myrmotherula brachyura*): One was seen by TP at the entrance track at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

Streak-headed (Long-tailed) Antbird (*Drymophila striaticeps*): Great looks of one along the Paty Trail Nov 3rd.

Spot-winged Antbird (*Schistocichla leucostigma*): A pair observed along the creek trail Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

Antpittas - *Formicariidae*

Undulated Antpitta (*Grallaria squamigera*): Heard at in the cloud forest of Bosque Unchog on Nov 4th and a nestling was in the nest tucked in the bank of a small creek at the same locality.

*Stripe-headed Antpitta (*Grallaria andicolus*) **near ENDEMIC**: Heard at Bosque Unchog Nov 4th and at the polylepis forest at La Quinoa on the 9th.

*Bay Antpitta (*Grallaria capitalis*) **ENDEMIC**: Heard at the Paty trailhead on Nov 3rd.

Tapaculos - *Rhinocryptidae*

*Large-footed Tapaculo (*Scytalopus macropus*) **ENDEMIC**: One heard along the Paty trail on Nov 3rd.

Tschudi's Tapaculo (*Scytalopus acutirostris*) **ENDEMIC**: One seen and a few heard along the Carpish tunnel track on Nov 5th; heard along the Paty Trail on Nov 3rd and at Bosque Unchog the following day.

Ovenbirds - *Furnariidae*

Coastal Miner (*Geositta peruviana*) **ENDEMIC**: Common at Lomas de Lachay with approximately 10 seen on Nov 11th.

Slender-billed Miner (*Geositta tenuirostris*): Excellent views of one beside the road in the Lago Junin area on Nov 2nd.

Common Miner (*Geositta cunicularia*): Fairly common in the puna grasslands with 10+ in the Lago Junin area Nov 2nd.

Thick-billed Miner (*Geositta crassirostris*) **ENDEMIC**: Nice views of this endemic miner with two along the road before the bridge at Santa Eulalia Valley Oct 31st.

Olivaceous Woodcreeper (*Sittasomus griseicapillus*): One observed in a bird flock Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

Wedge-billed Woodcreeper (*Glyphorhynchus spirurus*): One at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

Streaked Tuftedcheek (*Pseudocolaptes boissonneautii*): Two observed along the Paty Trail on Nov 3rd.

Pale-legged Hornero (*Furnarius leucopus*): Singles observed at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th and 7th and three seen at Villa Jennifer grounds the following day.

Wren-like Rushbird (*Phleocryptes melanops*): About five were seen and heard in the Pantanos de Villa marshes Oct 30th, and heard at Lago Junin on Nov 2nd.

Buff (Plain)-breasted Earthcreeper (*Upucerthia validirostris*): One beside the road at upper Santa Eulalia Road Oct 31st offering good looks, and another at Marcapomacocha Nov 1st.

Creamy-winged (Bar-winged) Cinclodes (*Cinclodes albiventris*): Common at high elevations with six at Upper Santa Eulalia Valley on Oct 31st; 10 at Ticlio and Marcapomacocha Nov 1st, and many in the Lago Junin and the Cerro de Pasco pass area Nov 2nd. A few were observed on Nov 9th and 10th while en route to Lima.

White-bellied Cinclodes (*Cinclodes palliatus*) **ENDEMIC Critically Endangered**: Birdlife International estimates less than 300 adults remaining. Four of this declining species was observed at Ticlio Bog on Nov 1st.

White-winged Cinclodes (*Cinclodes atacamensis*): Two were observed along fast flowing creeks in the upper Santa Eulalia River Oct 31st.

Surf Cinclodes (*Cinclodes taczanowskii*) **ENDEMIC**: Two were seen on the surf-sprayed rocks at Isla Palomino during the pelagic trip on the 12th.

Pearled Treerunner (*Margarornis squamiger*): Two observed in a bird flock at the Paty Trail on Nov 3rd; four seen at the Bosque Unchog cloud forest Nov 4th; and a couple were in a bird flock at Carpish Pass Nov 5th.

Rusty-crowned Tit-Spinetail (*Leptasthenura pileata*) **ENDEMIC**: Three observed foraging in shrubs above the bridge Santa Eulalia valley on Oct 31st.

*Line-fronted Canastero (*Asthenes urubambensis*): Heard in the moist bunchgrass grasslands around Bosque Unchog Nov 4th.

*Canyon Canastero (*Asthenes pudibunda*): Heard above the bridge at Santa Eulalia valley October 31st.

White-chinned Thistletail (*Asthenes fuliginosa*): One glimpsed and heard at Bosque Unchog Nov 4th.

Creamy-crested Spinetail (*Cranioleuca albicapilla*) **ENDEMIC**: Two of this pretty spinetail were at Hacienda La Florida on Nov 1st and heard on the grounds Nov 2nd and 10th.

Baron's Spinetail (*Cranioleuca baroni*) **ENDEMIC**: Four observed at La Quinoa *polylepis* forest on Nov 9th including one co-operative bird that sat in view beside the road.

Cactus Canastero (*Pseudasthenes cactorum*) **near ENDEMIC**: A walk through the scrub and cactus slopes of the dry valley at the east side of Lomas de Lachay produced great looks of one foraging in columnar cactus Nov 11th.

Azara's Spinetail (*Synallaxis azarae*): Good looks of an adult with young at the Paty Trail Nov 3rd and another at Carpish Pass on the 4th.

*Dark-breasted Spinetail (*Synallaxis albigularis*): Heard at the Villa Jennifer grounds on Nov 7th and 8th.

Rufous Spinetail (*Synallaxis unirufa*): Some of the group had good looks of a bird at the beginning of the Paty Trail Nov 3rd, and two were observed at close range at Carpish Pass on Nov 5th.

Tyrant Flycatchers - *Tyrannidae*

Southern Beardless Tyrannulet (*Camptostoma obsoletum*): Five at lower Santa Eulalia valley on the 1st and two the following day.

White-tailed Tyrannulet (*Mecocerculus poecilocercus*): Good looks of a couple along the Paty Trail Nov 3rd.

White-banded Tyrannulet (*Mecocerculus stictopterus*): One at the Carpish Pass trail on Nov 5th.

White-throated Tyrannulet (*Mecocerculus leucophrys*): A couple of pairs were seen at Bosque Unchog Nov 4th.

Pied-crested Tit-Tyrant (*Anairetes reguloides*): One observed in the lower Santa Eulalia valley on Oct 30th.

Yellow-billed Tit-Tyrant (*Anairetes flavirostris*): Two in the lower Santa Eulalia valley on Oct 30th; two in the upper Santa Eulalia valley the following day; and another at La Quinoa polylepis forest on Nov 9th.

Tufted Tit-Tyrant (*Anairetes parulus*): One at the grounds of Hacienda La Florida on Nov 2nd; and two observed en route to Bosque Unchog Nov 4th.

Unstreaked Tit-Tyrant (*Uromyias agraphia*) **ENDEMIC**: A group of six was observed in a bird flock along Carpish Pass Nov 3rd.

Forest Elaenia (*Myiopagis gaimardii*): Good looks of one at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

White-crested Elaenia (*Elaenia albiceps*): A single bird was at the start of the Paty Trail Nov 3rd.

Torrent Tyrannulet (*Serpophaga cinerea*): A begging young was observed along the Huallaga River on Nov 9th.

Olive-striped Flycatcher (*Mionectes striaticollis*): One at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

Slaty-capped Flycatcher (*Leptopogon superciliaris*): One along the Huallaga River track Nov 7th.

Marble-faced Bristle-Tyrant (*Phylloscartes ophthalmicus*): A single bird was seen at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

Peruvian Tyrannulet (*Zimmerius viridiflavus*) **ENDEMIC**: One foraging up in a tangle along the Paty trail on Nov 3rd.

Many-colored Rush-Tyrant (*Tachuris rubrigastra*): A group of about five of these sprightly gems were at Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th.

Rufous-headed Pygmy-Tyrant (*Pseudotriccus ruficeps*): Heard at the beginning of the Carpish Tunnel trail on the Nov 3rd.

Short-tailed Pygmy-Tyrant (*Myiornis ecaudatus*): Excellent looks of one a few meters away at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th.

Yellow-browed Tody-Flycatcher (*Todirostrum chrysocrotaphum*): One seen at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th and three seen in the park along the Huallaga River track Nov 7th.

Olivaceous Flatbill (*Rhynchocyclus olivaceus*): One observed at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th.

Yellow-breasted Flycatcher (*Tolmomyias flaviventris*): One at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

Cinnamon Flycatcher (*Pyrrhomyias cinnamomeus*): Three along the Paty trail on Nov 3rd.

Ochraceous-breasted Flycatcher (*Myiophobus ochraceiventris*): Good looks of a pair at Bosque Unchog on Nov 4th and a single observed at Carpish Pass the following day.

Sulphur-rumped Flycatcher (*Myiophobus barbatus*): Brief looks at one by TP at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th.

Olive-sided Flycatcher (*Contopus cooperi*): Two singles were seen and heard from the tops of snags at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th.

Wood-Pewee species (*Contopus sp.*): A non-calling wood-pewee was observed at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th.

Alder Flycatcher (*Empidonax alnorum*): A singing bird was observed on the grounds of Villa Jennifer on Nov 8th.

Black Phoebe (*Sayornis nigricans*): One or two seen almost daily along the Huallaga River between Nov 2nd and the 9th.

Vermillion Flycatcher (*Pyrocephalus rubinus*): Fairly common: several seen in the Lima area (including many of the “sooty” form), lower Santa Eulalia valley, and Lomas de Lachay.

Andean Negrito (*Lessonia oreas*): Common in the surrounding grasslands around Lago Junin Nov 2nd.

Jelski's Black-Tyrant (*Knipolegus signatus*): Good looks of one perched in the open at Carpish Pass Nov 5th.

Spot-billed Ground-Tyrant (*Muscisaxicola maculirostris*): Great looks of two in the vicinity of Ticlio Bog Nov 1st.

Taczanowski's Ground Tyrant (*Muscisaxicola griseus*): Good looks of one in the vicinity of the *polylepis* forest in the upper Santa Eulalia Valley on Oct 31st.

White-fronted Ground-Tyrant (*Muscisaxicola albifrons*): Five observed at Marcapomacocha Bog on Nov 1st and one Oct 31st.

Black-billed Shrike-Tyrant (*Agriornis montanus*): Three observed around Lago Junin on Nov 2nd and good looks of another along the roadside coming down from Bosque Unchog on Nov 4th.

Streak-throated Bush-Tyrant (*Myiotheretes striaticollis*): One observed high on a brushy slope during a brief highway stop en route an hour west of Huanuco Nov 9th.

Rufous-bellied Bush-Tyrant (*Myiotheretes fusciorufus*): Brief but good looks of one perched up in the open at Carpish Pass Nov 8th.

*Red-rumped Bush-Tyrant (*Cnemarchus erythropygius*): One heard in the grasslands near the Bosque Unchog entrance Nov 4th.

Rufous-webbed Bush-Tyrant (*Polioxolmis rufipennis*): One seen at the *polylepis* forest at La Quinoa on Nov 9th.

Rufous-breasted Chat-Tyrant (*Ochthoeca rufipectoralis*): A pair of this pretty tyrant was observed and heard at close range at Carpish Pass Nov 5th.

Brown-backed Chat-Tyrant (*Ochthoeca fumicolor*): Good looks on one perched mid-canopy at Bosque Unchog Nov 4th.

d'Orbigny's Chat-Tyrant (*Ochthoeca oenanthoides*): One observed at the *polylepis* grove at upper Santa Eulalia Valley on Oct 31st.

White-browed Chat-Tyrant (*Ochthoeca leucophrys*): Observed on the grounds of Hacienda La Florida Nov 1st and 4th and at the *polylepis* forest at La Quinoa Nov 9th.

Short-tailed Field-Tyrant (*Muscigralla brevicauda*): Five seen foraging in the dry valley of the eastern side of Lomas de Lachay Reserve Nov 11th.

Grayish Mourner (*Rhytipterna simplex*): One observed mid-story in the open, in a bird flock along the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park Nov 7th.

Greater Kiskadee (*Pitangus sulphuratus*): A couple seen and heard at Villa Jennifer Nov 5th to 8th.

Social Flycatcher (*Myiozetetes similes*): Common in the Tingo Maria area.

Gray-capped Flycatcher (*Myiozetetes granadensis*): Few seen at the Villa Jennifer grounds Nov 6th to 8th.

(Northern) Streaked Flycatcher (*Myiodynastes maculatus*): One observed at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 7th and another perched on the Villa Jennifer grounds on Nov 8th.

Tropical Kingbird (*Tyrannus melancholicus*): Common and widespread.

Cotingas - Cotingidae

Band-tailed Fruiteater (*Pipreola intermedia*): Good looks of one perched low in a tree along the Paty trail on Nov 3rd.

*White-cheeked Cotinga (*Zaratornis stresemanni*) **ENDEMIC Vulnerable**: One heard at the *polylepis* forest upper Santa Eulalia Valley Oct 31st.

Bay-vented Cotinga (*Doliornis sclateri*) **ENDEMIC Vulnerable**: Excellent scope looks of two perched in the open at Bosque Unchog Nov 4th.

Red-crested Cotinga (*Ampelion rubrocristatus*): Scope views of distant birds perched in the canopy of the Bosque Unchog forest Nov 4th.

Andean Cock-of-the-Rock (*Rupicola peruvianus*): A female observed going to a nest on a cliff face and then leaving at Gorge de Rio Chin Nov 8th, and a male was observed by Tom flying across the trail at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th.

Tityras and Becards - *Tityridae*

Black-crowned Tityra (*Tityra inquisitor*): One observed in a fruiting tree along the river track Tingo Maria National Park Nov 7th.

Masked Tityra (*Tityra semifasciata*): One observed in the canopy at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th.

Barred Becard (*Pachyramphus versicolor*): One in a bird flock at Carpish Pass Nov 5th.

White-winged Becard (*Pachyramphus polychopterus*): A female was on the Villa Jennifer grounds Nov 8th.

Pink-throated Becard (*Pachyramphus minor*): A nice male observed in the open, in a bird flock along the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park Nov 7th.

Jays - *Corvidae*

White-collared Jay (*Cyanolyca viridicyanus*): One by PJ along the road above the Paty trail on the 5th and one observed at the clearing/football pitch at the Paty trailhead on the 6th.

Violaceous Jay (*Cyanocorax violaceus*): Several seen at Villa Jennifer on the 7th and 8th and one on the 10th.

Swallows - *Hirundinidae*

Blue-and-White Swallow (*Pygochelidon cyanoleuca*): Common and widespread throughout the west, Andes, and east slope.

Brown-bellied Swallow (*Orochelidon murina*): Five observed foraging along the river at upper Santa Eulalia Valley Oct 31st; five en route to Huanuco Nov 2nd; four seen at Bosque Unchog Nov 4th; and common at La Quinua on Nov 9th.

Andean Swallow (*Orochelidon andecola*): Three seen en route to La Oroya from Tarma on Nov 10th.

White-banded Swallow (*Atticora fasciata*): Four observed foraging along the Huallaga River en route to and from Tingo Maria on Nov 5th and 8th.

Southern Rough-winged Swallow (*Stelgidopteryx ruficollis*): Five of this swallow at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 10th and six observed at Gorge de Rio Chin en route to Carpish Nov 8th.

Bank Swallow (*Riparia riparia*): Three hawking insects over the ponds Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th and one observed near Ondores, Lago Junin Nov 2nd.

Barn Swallow (*Hirundo rustica*): Fairly common along the coast with 10 observed at Pantanos de Villa on Oct 30th and the same number at Lomas de Lachay Nov 11th. Two were foraging at Lago Junin on Nov 2nd and two seen at Hacienda Santa Cruz on Nov 3rd.

Chestnut-collared Swallow (*Petrochelidon rufocollaris*): A flock of about 30 were foraging around us at Lomas de Lachay offering good views Nov 11th.

Wrens - Troglodytidae

Scaly-breasted (S. Nightingale) Wren (*Microcerculus marginatus*): One heard and seen along the river track Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 7th.

House Wren (*Troglodytes aedon*): Fairly common and widespread – observed and heard at a number of localities.

Mountain Wren (*Troglodytes solstitialis*): Three were observed at Carpish Pass on Nov 5th and one on Nov 8th.

Fasciated Wren (*Campylorhynchus fasciatus*): Fairly common around Hacienda Santa Cruz: heard Nov 3rd and 9th and a group of three were observed Nov 5th.

Gray-breasted Mountain-Wren (*Henicorhina leucophrys*): Several heard at the Carpish Pass and Paty Trails. One observed by Tom Nov 3rd.

Dippers - Cinclidae

White-capped Dipper (*Cinclus leucocephalus*): Good looks of one along the river at upper Santa Eulalia Valley on Oct 31st.

Thrushes - Turdidae

Swainson's Thrush (*Catharus ustulatus*): One seen and heard along the Paty Trail Nov 3rd.

*White-eared Solitaire (*Entomodestes leucotis*): Heard along the Paty trail Nov 3rd.

Hauxwell's Thrush (*Turdus hauxwelli*): One observed on a roadside stop en route to Carpish Pass on Nov 8th. This thrush is more overall rufescent in coloration compared to the previous species.

Black-billed Thrush (*Turdus ignobilis*): One observed along the Paty Trail Nov 3rd and common in the Tingo Maria area – several seen daily at Villa Jennifer.

Great Thrush (*Turdus fuscater*): Fairly common at higher elevations. A pair at Hacienda La Florida provided good comparison with Chiguanco Thrush.

Chiguanco Thrush (*Turdus chiguanco*): Fairly common at higher elevations on the west slope.

Glossy-black Thrush (*Turdus serranus*): Great looks of one perched in a tree along the Paty Trail Nov 3rd.

Mockingbirds - *Mimidae*

Long-tailed Mockingbird (*Mimus longicaudatus*): Common along the coast and lower Santa Eulalia valley. Many observed in the Lima area Oct 30th and Santa Eulalia valley Oct 31st.

Pipits - *Motacillidae*

Yellowish Pipit (*Anthus lutescens*): Fairly common at Lomas de Lachay with about 15 seen Nov 11th.

Short-billed Pipit (*Anthus furcatus*): Good views of one on the ground at Ondores, Lago Junin Nov 2nd.

Paramo Pipit (*Anthus bogotensis*): A couple of these pipits flew up and then down into the wet grasslands near Bosque Unchog Nov 4th. This is the only pipit occurring in Paramo.

Wood Warbler - *Parulidae*

Masked Yellowthroat (*Geothlypis aequinoctialis auricularis*): Great looks of a singing male at Lomas de Lachay on Nov 11th.

Citrine Warbler (*Myiothlypis luteoviridis*): Five along the Paty trail on Nov 3rd and two along the Carpish Tunnel track on Nov 5th.

Buff-rumped Warbler (*Myiothlypis fulvicauda*): One observed and a few heard along the stream at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th and good looks of one foraging on a small path along the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park Nov 7th.

Golden-bellied Warbler (*Myiothlypis chrysogaster*): Two were seen in Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th.

Canada Warbler (*Cardellina canadensis*): Pablo observed one at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

Spectacled Redstart (*Myioborus melanocephalus*): Three at the Paty trailhead Nov 3rd, seven observed along the Carpish Tunnel track Nov 5th and two on Nov 8th.

Tanagers - *Thraupidae*

Red-capped Cardinal (*Paroaria gularis*): Two were observed at the Huallaga River bridge, Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th.

Magpie Tanager (*Cissopis leverianus*): Singles observed at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th-7th and two were observed at Gorge de Rio Chin Nov 8th.

Black-capped Hemispingus (*Hemispingus atopileus*): Two were seen along the Carpish Tunnel trail Nov 3rd.

Drab Hemispingus (*Hemispingus xanthophthalmus*): A group of six in a bird flock at the Carpish Pass tunnel area on Nov 5th and a single Nov 8th.

Rufous-chested Tanager (*Thlypopsis ornata*): Three of these pretty birds were observed at the trailhead of Paty trail Nov 3rd and one at Carpish Tunnel trail Nov 5th.

Brown-flanked Tanager (*Thlypopsis pectoralis*) **ENDEMIC**: Great views on one by the road en route to Bosque Unchog Nov 4th and another observed along the Carpish Tunnel trail Nov 5th.

Pardusco (*Nephelornis oneilli*) **ENDEMIC**: Several small groups of this odd tanager were observed at the Bosque Unchog cloud forest Nov 4th.



Yellow-crested Tanager (*Tachyphonus rufiventer*): One was observed in a bird flock along the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 7th.

White-shouldered Tanager (*Tachyphonus luctuosus*): One observed in a bird flock along the stream trail Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th.

Black-bellied (Huallaga) Tanager (*Ramphocelus melanogaster*) **ENDEMIC**: This endemic was fairly common on the Villa Jennifer grounds and Tingo Maria National Park. Several were seen daily Nov 5th to Nov 8th.

Silver-beaked Tanager (*Ramphocelus carbo*): Common in the Tingo Maria area.

Hooded Mountain Tanager (*Buthraupis montana*): Two observed at the Paty Trail trailhead Nov 3rd; three including one begging young were observed at the Carpish Tunnel trail Nov 3rd and a single Nov 8th.

Grass-green Tanager (*Chloronis riefferii*): Some of the group were fortunate enough to see a small group of three of these dazzlers, in a bird flock along the Carpish Tunnel trail Nov 5th.

Lacrimose Mountain-Tanager (*Anisognathus lacrymosus*): Two seen along at the Paty Trailhead Nov 3rd and four at the Carpish Tunnel trail Nov 5th.

Scarlet-bellied Mountain-Tanager (*Anisognathus igniventris*): This stunning bird is common in the Bosque Unchog area with about 20 of these gorgeous birds seen Nov 4th.

Blue-winged Mountain-Tanager (*Anisognathus somptuosus*): Two were along the Paty trail on the 6th.

Buff-breasted Mountain Tanager (*Dubusia taeniata*): Two observed in a bird flock at Bosque Unchog Nov 2nd.

Chestnut-bellied Mountain Tanager (*Dubusia castaneiventris*): Two were at the Carpish Tunnel area on Nov 3rd.

Yellow-scarfed Tanager (*Iridosornis reinhardti*): Another pretty tanager of cloud forest with a single observed at Bosque Unchog Nov 4th and four along the Carpish Tunnel trail Nov 5th.

Blue-and-Yellow Tanager (*Pipraeidea bonariensis*): Fairly common in the Santa Eulalia valley and on the grounds of Hacienda La Florida, outside Tarma. Several were seen daily Oct 30th to Nov 2nd.

Blue-grey Tanager (*Thraupis episcopus*): Three observed in the Lima area Oct 30th and four were at Hacienda Santa Cruz Nov 3rd. Common in the Tingo Maria area.

Palm Tanager (*Thraupis palmarum*): Common in the Tingo Maria area.

Blue-capped Tanager (*Thraupis cyanocephala*): Five along the Paty trail on Nov 3rd and one on Nov 5th.

Yellow-bellied Tanager (*Tangara xanthogastra*): One observed by some of the group at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th and another observed at Gorge de Rio Chin Nov 8th.

Turquoise Tanager (*Tangara mexicana*): One at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th, and two observed at Villa Jennifer Nov 8th.

Flame-faced Tanager: (*Tangara parzudakii*): One seen in a bird flock along the Paty trail on Nov 3rd.

Green-and-Gold Tanager (*Tangara schrankii*): One observed in a flock at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

Bay-headed Tanager (*Tangara gyrola*): Three observed in a flock at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

Blue-necked Tanager (*Tangara cyanicollis*): A couple seen at Tingo Maria National Park Nov 6th and 7th; and one at Villa Jennifer Nov 8th.

Beryl-spangled Tanager (*Tangara nigroviridis*): About seven seen in bird flocks along the Paty trail on Nov 3rd.

Black-faced Dacnis (*Dacnis lineata*): A couple of these pretty birds were along the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park Nov 7th.

Blue Dacnis (*Dacnis cayana*): Three were observed at the Villa Jennifer grounds on Nov 8th.

Green Honeycreeper (*Chlorophanes spiza*): Two were observed in a bird flock at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

Purple Honeycreeper (*Cyanerpes caeruleus*): Two near the oilbird cave sat Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 7th.

Chestnut-vented Conebill (*Conirostrum speciosum*): Good looks of one along the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park Nov 7th.

Cinereous Conebill (*Conirostrum cinereum*): Common in the Santa Eulalia valley with four seen on the 30th and 8 on Oct 31st; and common on the grounds of Hacienda La Florida with many seen every day Nov 1st, 2nd and 10th. Roughly 20 observed at the wet side of Lomas de Lachay Reserve Nov 11th.

Blue-backed Conebill (*Conirostrum sitticolor*): One was observed along the Carpath Tunnel track Nov 5th.

Capped Conebill (*Conirostrum albifrons*): Three observed along the Paty trail Nov 3rd.

Giant Conebill (*Oreomanes fraseri*): One observed at the *polylepis* woodland at upper Santa Eulalia valley Oct 31st. This large conebill is a *polylepis* specialist.

Rusty Flowerpiercer (*Diglossa sittoides*): One on the grounds of our accommodation lower Santa Eulalia valley Oct 30th and another in the gardens of Hacienda La Florida outside Tarma Nov 2nd. Pablo had one at Lomas de Lachay Nov 11th.

Moustached Flowerpiercer (*Diglossa mystacalis*): Two were observed at Bosque Unchog Nov 4th.

Black-throated Flowerpiercer (*Diglossa brunneiventris*): Fairly common on the grounds of Hacienda La Florida with a few seen Nov 1st and 2nd, and Nov 8th and 9th. Several observed at the cloud forest at Bosque Unchog Nov 4th.

Masked Flowerpiercer (*Diglossa cyanea*): Three were observed along the Paty trail on Nov 3rd.

Peruvian Sierra-Finch (*Phrygilus punensis*): Fairly common in the highlands: several at upper Santa Eulalia valley Oct 31st; a single observed at Ticlio Bog Nov 1st and two were observed at Lago Junin the following day; five were at La Quinoa Nov 10th and seen in the highlands en route to Lima Nov 10th.

Mourning Sierra-Finch (*Phrygilus fruticeti*): Great looks of two foraging along the river at upper Santa Eulalia valley Oct 31st.

Plumbeous Sierra-Finch (*Phrygilus unicolor*): A few observed at high elevation: two at upper Santa Eulalia valley Oct 31st, four in the Marcapomacocha Bog area Nov 1st and two in the Cerro de Pasco Pass area Nov 9th.

Ash-breasted Sierra-Finch (*Phrygilus plebejus*): One at Marcapomacocha bog Nov 1st, and two observed in the Lago Junin area Nov 2nd.

Band-tailed Sierra-Finch (*Phrygilus alaudinus*): Roughly 10 observed in the upper Santa Eulalia valley Oct 31st and the same number at the dry east side of Lomas de Lachay on Nov 11th.

White-winged Diuca-Finch (*Diuca speculifera*): Two were observed near Marcapomacocha Bog on Oct 31st en route to Tarma and eight were in the vicinity of Marcapomacocha on Nov 1st.

Great Inca Finch (*Incaspiza pulchra*) **ENDEMIC**: Great looks of this cool looking endemic with six seen in the Santa Eulalia valley Oct 31st.

Collared Warbling-Finch (*Poospiza hispaniolensis*): Good views of a male were had at Lomas de Lachay Nov 11th.

Bright-rumped Yellow-Finch (*Sicalis uropygialis*): About 10 observed at upper Santa Eulalia valley Oct 31st and common in the *altiplano* around Lago Junin Nov 2nd.

Greenish Yellow-Finch (*Sicalis olivascens*): A flock of about 20 seen in the upper Santa Eulalia Oct 31st.

Blue-black Grassquit (*Volatinia jacarina*): A couple observed in Lima Oct 30th; about 10 observed in Santa Eulalia valley Oct 31st; two at the Villa Jennifer grounds Nov 8th; and five seen in Lima at our hotel Nov 12th.

Chestnut-throated Seedeater (*Sporophila telasco*): Only one observed at Pantanos de Villa on Oct 31st.

Black-and-White Seedeater (*Sporophila luctuosa*): One seen on the grounds of Villa Jennifer by Pablo, Mitch, and Amy on Nov 8th.

Yellow-bellied Seedeater (*Sporophila nigricollis*): Three were on the Hacienda Santa Cruz grounds on Nov 5th and one on Nov 9th.

Chestnut-bellied (Lesser) Seed-Finch (*Sporophila angolensis*): Fairly common at Villa Jennifer with a single seen on Nov 5th, three on the 7th and four on Nov 8th.

Band-tailed Seedeater (*Catamenia analis*): Fairly common in the Santa Eulalia valley with 10 seen Oct 30th and two the following day.

Plain-colored Seedeater (*Catamenia inornata*): About 10 observed in the fields en route to Bosque Unchog Nov 4th.

Paramo Seedeater (*Catamenia homochroa*): Great looks of a pair along the Carpish Tunnel trail Nov 5th.

Bananaquit (*Coereba flaveola*): Fairly common at Villa Jennifer and Tingo Maria National Park. Several observed daily Nov 6th to 8th.

Buff-throated Saltator (*Saltator maximus*): Two observed on the Villa Jennifer grounds Nov 8th.

Grayish Saltator (*Saltator coerulescens*): One along the river track Tingo Maria National Park Nov 7th.

Golden-billed Saltator (*Saltator aurantiirostris*): Fairly common in the dry intermontane valleys with four seen on the grounds of La Florida Nov 1st, a single the following day, and two on Nov 10th. Many were seen en route to Bosque Unchog Nov 4th.

Sparrows - *Emberizidae*

Orange-billed Sparrow (*Arremon aurantiirostris*): Good looks of a pair foraging in the undergrowth at Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

Tricolored Brush-Finch (*Atlapetes tricolor*): Three observed at the clearing at the beginning of the Paty trail Nov 3rd.

Slaty Brush-Finch (*Atlapetes schistaceus*): Two observed at shrubby field borders near Bosque Unchog Nov 4th and good looks of one were had along the Carpish Tunnel trail on Nov 5th.

Rusty-bellied Brush-Finch (*Atlapetes nationi*) **ENDEMIC**: Common above the bridge at upper Santa Eulalia valley with more than 20 observed Oct 31st.

Yellow-browed Sparrow (*Ammodramus aurifrons*): One observed along the Huallaga River at Gorge de Rio Chin Nov 8th.

Rufous-collared Sparrow (*Zonotrichia capensis*): Common and widespread in the highlands.

Common Chlorospingus (*Chlorospingus ophthalmicus*): Two observed along the Paty Trail by Nov 3rd.

Grosbeak Cardinals - *Cardinalidae*

Hepatic Tanager (*Piranga flava*): One was observed along the stream trail Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

Scarlet Tanager (*Piranga olivacea*): One was observed along the stream trail Tingo Maria National Park on Nov 6th.

Golden (-bellied) Grosbeak (*Pheucticus chrysogaster*): Common in the Santa Eulalia valley and dry intermontane valleys: three at Santa Eulalia on Oct 30th and over 20 seen the following day, several observed each day at Hacienda Santa Cruz and en route to Bosque Unchog Nov 3rd to 5th.

Blue-black Grosbeak (*Cyanocompsa cyanoides*): MG at Tingo Maria National Park observed a female Nov 6th.

Blackbirds - Icteridae

Peruvian Meadowlark (*Sturnella bellicosa*): Three were at Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th; one on the grounds of Hacienda Santa Cruz Nov 3rd and 15 in adjacent fields the following day and on Nov 9th. Several observed in fields around Huanuco, Nov 10th and 11th. Up to 50 seen at Lomas de Lachay Nov 14th including many singing males.

Scrub Blackbird (*Dives warszewiczi*): Common in the Lima area and lower Santa Eulalia valley with many seen and heard Oct 30th and 31st.

Shiny Cowbird (*Molothrus bonariensis*): One observed at Hacienda Santa Cruz on Nov 5th.

Oriole Blackbird (*Gymnomystax mexicanus*): Two observed at the Hacienda Santa Cruz grounds Nov 3rd and singles on Nov 5th and 9th.

Yellow-hooded Blackbird (*Chrysomus icterocephalus*): Two males of this introduced population were observed at Pantanos de Villa Oct 30th.

Solitary Black Cacique (*Cacicus solitarius*): One along the Huallaga River track Nov 7th and good looks of one in the open at Villa Jennifer Nov 8th.

Orange-backed Troupial (*Icterus icterus*): Good looks of one in a fruiting tree along the Huallaga River track Nov 7th.

Yellow-rumped Cacique (*Cacicus cela*): Common at Tingo Maria with several seen daily at Villa Jennifer and Tingo Maria National Park Nov 5th-8th.

Mountain Cacique (*Cacicus chrysonotus*): A flock of five was seen at the beginning of the Paty Trail on Nov 3rd.

Red-rumped Cacique (*Cacicus haemorrhous*): Tom and Pablo observed one flying across the road at Gorge de Rio Chin Nov 8th.

Russet-backed Oropendola (*Psarocolius angustifrons*): Common at Tingo Maria with several daily seen at Villa Jennifer and Tingo Maria National Park Nov 5th-8th.

Crested Oropendola (*Psarocolius decumanus*): Three observed along the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park Nov 7th and a single at Villa Jennifer Nov 8th.

Finches - Fringillidae

Thick-billed Euphonia (*Euphonia lanirostris*): A few observed at daily at Villa Jennifer and Tingo Maria National Park Nov 5th to 7th.

Bronze-green Euphonia (*Euphonia mesochrysa*): A pair observed at the nest along the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park Nov 7th.

White-vented Euphonia (*Euphonia minuta*): One seen at the oilbird caves, Tingo Maria National Park Nov 5th and another at Villa Jennifer Nov 8th.

Orange-bellied Euphonia (*Euphonia xanthogaster*): One observed along the Huallaga River track, Tingo Maria National Park Nov 7th and another the following day at Villa Jennifer.

Thick-billed Siskin (*Spinus crassirostris*): About 10 of these *polylepis* associated species were observed at the La Quinoa forest on Nov 9th.

Hooded Siskin (*Spinus magellanicus*): Fairly common in the highlands where flocks were seen at several localities including: Hacienda Santa Cruz, Tarma; and en route to Bosque Unchog where very common.

Olivaceous Siskin (*Spinus olivaceus*): One observed at approximately 1,500 m elevation at a roadside stop en route to Carpisah Pass Nov 8th.

Black Siskin (*Spinus atrata*): About 20 in small groups seen in the Lago Junin area Nov 2nd.

Old World Sparrows - *Passeridae*

House Sparrow (*Passer domesticus*): One observed en route to Tingo Maria Nov 5th and a couple observed at Huanuco Nov 9th.

Mammals

Spear-nosed Bat (*Phyllostomas hastatus*): Great looks of this large bat roosting at the oilbird cave Nov 6th.

Short-tailed Fruit Bat (*Carollia sp*): Many of the small bats at the oilbird caves on Nov 2nd were of this genus.

European Hare (*Lepus europaeus*): Greater than 50 of this introduced invasive species were observed in the marshes at the north end of Lago Junin Nov 2nd.

Montane Cavy (*Cavia tschudii*): Pablo observed one by the bridge at the north end of Lago Junin. The burrows of this common mammal were in evidence around Lago Junin.

Brown Agouti (*Dasyprocta variegata*): One observed by Tom crossing the trail at Carpisah Pass Nov 5th.

South American Sea Lion (*Otaria flavescens*): Thousands seen at the Isla Palomino colony Nov 11th.

Dusky Dolphin (*Lagenorhynchus obscurus*): Hundreds seen during the pelagic trip Nov 11th.

Vicuna (*Vicugna vicugna*): Many small herds were observed on the way to Lago Junin Nov 2nd, and five were seen outside Tarma en route to Oroya Nov 10th.

Northern Viscacha (*Lagidium peruanum*): Excellent looks of one along the roadside near Marcapomacocha Oct 31st.
